





CarePartners-Program Goals

- ► Increase access to healthcare and existing community resources for low income, uninsured adults.
- ► Support healthy behaviors, appropriate utilization of healthcare services, and improve health status outcomes for enrollees.
 - MaineHealth, *lead hospitals in each coverage area, volunteer providers, Anthem Blue Cross and Blue Shield donates third party administrative services and Martin's Point donates data analysis

CarePartners

Three components of the program are:

- Volunteer provider network (primary care providers, specialists & hospitals)
- Case management (provided by bachelors level social work case managers/experienced social service workers)
- Affordable pharmaceuticals through a limited formulary, prescription assistance program applications & information on \$4 generics





CarePartners Accomplishments

(June 2001-November 2015)

- CarePartners has assisted over 39,289 individuals with healthcare and social service needs and enrolled 11,473 individuals into the program
- Providers have donated \$33.5 million in medical services to Portland enrollees
- Staff have assisted enrollees in obtaining 30,521
 PAPs medications valued at over \$22 million
- An additional 52,310 medications were filled for CarePartners enrollees and paid for through program funding.



York County CarePartners

(May 2013-Dec 2015)

- 298 enrolled in the CarePartners program
 - 638 individuals screened
- 29 individuals transferred from CarePartners to insurance sources (including MaineCare, Medicare, ACA or private insurance)
- 77 of those screened & were ineligible for CP were assisted with MaineCare applications

York CarePartners Medical and Pharmacy services


- 578 Patient Assistance Program applications completed for CP patients
- Medications received valued at \$1,152,796
- 280 prescriptions paid for by the program
 - Cost of medications paid for by CP \$25,086
- \$1,377,825 medical services donated by community providers (the amount for 2015 may increase until April 2016)


Emergency Room visits per 1,000 Member Months (MM) All sites Twelve-month Rolling Average
